

Many families have silverware which they love – and curse. Museums do not spend their time polishing silver. It damages the silver and wears it thin. One good clean and then proper storage prevents tarnishing and allows for use without having to always repolish. For items on display a very thin coating of renovating wax will prevent tarnish. Albox

Albox are one of Australia's premier archival polyethylene sleeves, making archival plastic for different uses in many different shapes and sizes. Albox sleeves and folders are designed to hold different format protector pockets in sizes from negative, right up to A3. Choices of sleeve (in 25 pack) come in the following:

35mm Negative 4 strip, 35mm negative 6 strip, 120mm negative, collector card, 5"x4" negatives, 35mm slides, tabs (for inclusion of information in the sleeves), double CD/DVD pocket, 6"x4" with tab, 6"x4" no tab, 7"x5", 7.5"x5", 8"x6", 9"x6", full page, panoramic, A3, foolscap, A4.

<u>Intercept</u>

Corrosion Intercept is a copper loaded polyethylene film used to scavenge nitrides, sulphides, and chlorides. The technology has also been developed into a wide range of copper loaded foams and canvas. Copper is a highly reactive metal and will react with contaminating gaseous ions preferentially. The copper in the plastic behaves similarly to a sacrificial anode. The Intercept acts as a protectant and helps to prevent tarnishing on metals.

Insect Prevention

Insect prevention is vital to any collection, as insect damage can amount to huge losses in collections. Endangered Heritage offers insect pheromone based lures to attract the insects away from objects that would otherwise be the most attractive scent.

Why pheromone lures? Using insecticides can have lasting effects on objects if the wrong types are used. Pheromone lures are a gentle approach which is highly effective and have no damaging effects on the objects in collections. One lure can cover a large amount of space, with one per household usually sufficient enough to cover the whole area.

<u>Silverfish:</u> Australian silverfish do not have the mouthparts to chew through fibres like wool, but are usually an indication of a leak or wet area. Silverfish are highly damaging to books, paper objects and cellulose fibres.

Webbing Moth: Webbing moth are usually the easiest to spot when looking for insect damage. The moth spins a web which it envelops itself inside as a larvae, emerging as a moth which looks similar to a small piece of golden straw about the size of a long grain of rice. One female webbing moth can lay up to 50 eggs with the larvae feeding on fibres, which is why they are so damaging to collections.

<u>Carpet Beetle:</u> Carpet Beetle, sometimes known as woolly bears, are one of the most damaging insects to be found in any collection. The adults are very small, usually around the size of half a pinhead, but capable of mass destruction. Adults often fly around areas of the home, infesting cupboards, carpets and other natural fibres and laying eggs which hatch into fibre eating larvae. They are incredibly hard to see as a larvae, but leave a shedded skin behind once they have completed a moult.

Training

The team from Endangered Heritage deliver professional development training for museum professionals. We personalise the training to target your own collection type. Additionally we are available for public talks on conservation. These talks are aimed at the public wanting to care for family history, memorabilia, photos etc., for which we charge you our day rate, and which you can then bill out to increase revenue for your organisation. Introduction to museum practice

This introduction covers archival storage materials, their importance, use and application.

- Object handling and glove protocols
- Introduction to environmental risk factors including humidity, lighting, temperature, acidity
- Documentation: why, what, how, when and where. There are times when documentation needs to be in the box or in the database. Covering documentation for donation, storage, display and public exposure.
- Integrated pest management and mould hazards: What does this really mean and how do we implement it? Covering Work Health and Safety standards on pesticides, mothballs, lavender and other myths and misconceptions.
- Samples of archival material provided

Workshop will cover theory, practical demonstration, and some hands-on.

Museum Work Health & Safety

Invention and design make new products safer. Clearly that means everything dangerous, obsolete, hazardous or downright toxic ends up in our museums. This workshop runs over and covers asbestos, radioactivity, heavy metals, pigments, electrical hazards, plastic, off gassing, PBCs, lead paint, biological hazards, and the things which start out being safe but become toxic as they age/break down, creating inhalation risks.

This workshop is a must-do for all managers and team leaders and all intake officers accepting donations. The workshop is filled with practical advice, referrals and identification methods. It is tailored to the collection of each client to cover the immediate risks and long term hazards which come with working in museums. The shared responsibility to donors, volunteers and the public when things go on display is covered. The workshop also covers large technology collections, vehicles and hazards.

As the information is built upon previously discussed material is it requested attendees are present for both days and do not leave sessions.

<u>Disaster planning and preparedness.</u>

There are many disasters and hazards which can put a collection at risk, so a clear plan prior to a crisis is essential. This workshop covers fire, flood, mould and insect hazards and management; the planning, the response to outside agencies, e.g. insurance providers, and the short term and long term needs a collection is likely to have following a disaster. One full day 9-4 with the presenter staying back for 1 hour for additional questions.

Planning and triaging personal safety in a crisis and discussions on hypotheticals relevant to the clients collection.

Managing volunteers in your museum

As things begin to return to normal, we will find a lot has changed in our museums, historical sites and collections. The availability of volunteers, organising them in the COVID-19 environment, and getting essential work done is more tricky compared to before. Managing volunteers can be harder work than people think. How do we select them? Direct them? Keeping their interest and mediating in conflicts between them is difficult; some volunteers can become territorial and possessive of a collection or a database, making it harder to attract and keep other volunteers or even staff. This training session will cover selection, roles, responsibilities, training needs and rosters, all through the eyes of the collection and the artefacts.

We will also cover the major needs of a collection which may be marketing, website, open days and getting funding and revenue into a collection.

IT Support Services

Database Services

Implementing a new database system is a daunting task for any business or museum. Data and information are the lifeblood of any organisation but many institutions stick to what they know rather than tackle the important topic of information management. We can create for you a customised database from scratch, or implement popular collection management systems such as kEMU, eHive or Mosaic. Development of database

One of the most important things to keep in mind is that with technology and information there is a high likelihood of it getting lost, corrupted and damaged. Developing physical and digital back-ups of data allows for the retrieval of lost data.

Security

You wouldn't want any of your data and information to fall in the wrong hands. We will be able to develop a security plan, including who can access specific information, and assigning privileges to certain users for what information they can access and modify.

Develop training manual

Some databases can be complex and take a while to get used to, so having a training manual is handy. We can develop a manual showing how to use the new database and including common database operations. It will also include troubleshooting for common errors that may occur.

Ongoing support package

Learning new systems is always a steep learning curve. With the ongoing support package, we are able to assist in data entry, updates on the current system and aid in common IT related issues.

<u>Data migration</u>

Your data is important regardless of how it was kept, whether it was with pen and paper, in an Excel spreadsheet or on your previous database. We will ensure that all your data gets transferred over to the new system.

Database Training

It's often difficult to find and train staff on how to use any new system. Depending on the database that is being used in your organisation, we can develop training sessions for staff or volunteers on how to use the database
